Initial Assessment

	[] Identify type of disaster:
	[] Flood or water exposure
	[] Fire or extreme heat
	[] Earthquake, tornado, hurricane or falling debris
	[] Chemical contamination or mold
Resea	rch
	[] Contact manufacturer with model and serial number for disaster-specific guidance
	[] Ask if they offer discounted replacements
	[] Check with your insurance carrier(s) to determine if your child restraints are covered by the homeowner's policy or automobile policy
	[] Check for recalls via NHTSA Recall Lookup
Visual	Inspection
	[] Check for cracks, warping, or discoloration on shell
	[] Inspect harness for fraying, tears, mildew, or mold
	[] Examine buckles and metal parts for corrosion or rust
	[] Ensure labels and instruction manual are present and legible
Always Contact the Manufacturer If	
	[] Seat was submerged in water or exposed to sewage/chemicals
	[] Signs of fire damage or smoke damage (even minor discoloration or odor)
	[] You cannot verify full history and condition
	[] If the integrity of any component of the car seat is in question
Prepar	redness Tips (for future events)
	[] Store CRS off ground, away from windows or flood zones
	[] Keep manual and registration in a waterproof bag
	[] Register CRS to receive recall/safety alerts
